
Featuring Rev. Teri Todd

Directions to The Hideaway

Approximately 40 minutes from the Parker area. All roads to the Hideaway Inn are paved and maintained.

- Drive south on Parker Road/HWY 83 (30 miles south of Parker UMC)
- Turn left at Walker Road/HWY 105
- Take Walker Road for $\frac{1}{2}$ mile
- Go into the trees and look to the right for the stone and stucco sign

◆ Weekend Registration ◆
