

Stephen Ministers aren't counselors and don't try to "fix" things. They help by just being present and listening. Female Stephen Ministers are paired with women; male Stephen Ministers are paired with men. And everything that is shared with a Stephen Minister is confidential. Nothing is shared with church staff or anyone else—not even the fact that a specific person has a Stephen Minister.

Friends, as many of you may already know, the United Methodist General Conference has been postponed until August 29 – September 6, 2022 due to the coronavirus. The Commission on the General Conference decided on February 20, 2021 to move the meeting dates to 2022 as the COVID-19 pandemic continues to affect the safety of mass gatherings and travel. It is currently scheduled for Aug. 29 – Sept. 6, 2022 in Minneapolis, Minnesota.

The Commission on General Conference based this decision with the following concerns mentioned in the report regarding having a virtual session include:

- Lack of infrastructure in some areas, including Internet access, Internet speed, and electricity
- Lack of technology for equitable Holy Conferencing
- Complexity of the legislative committee process
- Concerns about accurate credentialing and verification of identity
- Difficulties in seating reserve delegates properly
- Security of voting
- Safety concerns about regional satellite gatherings

While it has been difficult to wait for this larger leadership body to meet and make denominational decisions, given the recent surge in the Delta variant, it was a prudent call to make. In the meantime, there is no 'vote' to be taken nor any decisions for the local church to make. When the local church is presented with options for discussion, plenty of time will be given for all aspects to be discussed. The last point to remember is that there will be up to two years to study and decide our course <u>after</u> General Conference concludes. In the meantime, let's not become distracted from our local ministry opportunities.
